Supporting Local Civic Groups

The credit union philosophy is "people helping people." This is not merely a slogan but a mission put into action with all employees at Y-12 FCU. In addition to the charitable organizations we serve, employees are also active in local civic groups. These include:

Chambers of Commerce

As active community partners, we are members of the Chambers of Commerce in all of our communities. The branch staff host events, volunteer on committees, and serve as ambassadors and board members.

Community Leadership Programs

Our employees participate in leadership programs for Anderson, Blount, and Campbell counties; Oak Ridge; and East Tennessee Regional Leadership.

Local United Way Agencies

Employees volunteer as allocation committee members and board members.

Area First Responders

Each month during new employee orientation, all new hires participate in the "teddy bear" service project. The team makes custom stuffed animals complete in Y-12 FCU logo attire. The animals are delivered to local first responders. The teddy bears are given to children to comfort them when they are in frightening situations.

Improving Financial Outreach

The primary focus of the Financial Outreach department is to teach financial responsibility and education to people of ALL ages.

School Branches

In 2010, Y-12 FCU partnered with two schools to open our first student-run branches. Since that time the program has grown to 12 school branches, including nine high schools and three middle schools. Thousands of students have had the opportunity to open credit union accounts and learn about establishing good financial habits, and many have gained hands-on experience working as volunteer Member Service Consultants.

Often, Member Service Consultants will continue as student interns and work in one of the Y-12 FCU branches. Since the inception of the program several interns have gone on to become full- or part-time Y-12 FCU employees.

Scholarships

In 2010, Y-12 FCU introduced the Bill T. Hicks Scholarship, named for the former Y-12 FCU Board Chair and educator in the Oak Ridge School District. This award recognizes the achievement of student members graduating from high school. Over \$56,000 has been awarded to date.

Summer and After-School Programs

When school is not in session, the Financial Outreach team is still going strong. They work with organizations such as Boys & Girls Club and Junior Achievement in camps, classrooms, or wherever there is an opportunity to provide financial literacy lessons.

Y-12 FCU Gives Foundation

The Y-12 Gives Foundation was founded in 2017 to provide grants for area nonprofit organizations.

Y-12 Federal Credit Union introduced the Y-12 FCU Gives Foundation to extend our mission of "people helping people." The goal of the foundation is to partner with nonprofit organizations in the communities we serve that share our core values. The primary areas of focus for the foundation have been:

- Health and wellness Education
- · Responding to emerging community needs

Since the launch of the Y-12 FCU Gives Foundation in 2017, grants have been approved for over **\$121,765.39** to nonprofit organizations in our service area, which includes Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Knox, Loudon, Roane, Sevier, and Union counties.

The funds to support the grants are provided by Y-12 Federal Credit Union and Y-12 FCU Gives Foundation fundraisers. The fundraisers include the Y-Run 5K, the first annual Y-12 FCU Gives Golf Tournament, candy bar sales, and employee payroll deductions.

Effective with the 2020 grant cycle, the Y-12 FCU Gives Foundation is shifting its primary focus to fighting childhood hunger.

The new mission statement is to reduce the number of undernourished children in the communities we serve by providing them with food, knowledge, and resources.

Providing Legislative Advocacy

Legislative advocacy is important to Y-12 Federal Credit Union, as we monitor legislation that has an impact on our members. We are engaged with our local legislators by serving on Chamber advocacy panels and attending other events such as local legislator debates, the Governor's annual breakfast, and the East Tennessee Regional Legislative meeting.

Key personnel and board members regularly represent Y-12 FCU at legislative conferences and forums – including the Credit Union National Association (CUNA) Governmental Affairs Conference and the National Association of Federally-Insured Credit Unions (NAFCU) Congressional Caucus. These events provide opportunities to network with credit union peers throughout the country and learn more about issues most critical to credit unions. Y-12 FCU executives also meet with legislators to address the concerns regarding regulatory burden and understanding the impact that the regulations have on credit unions and their members.
